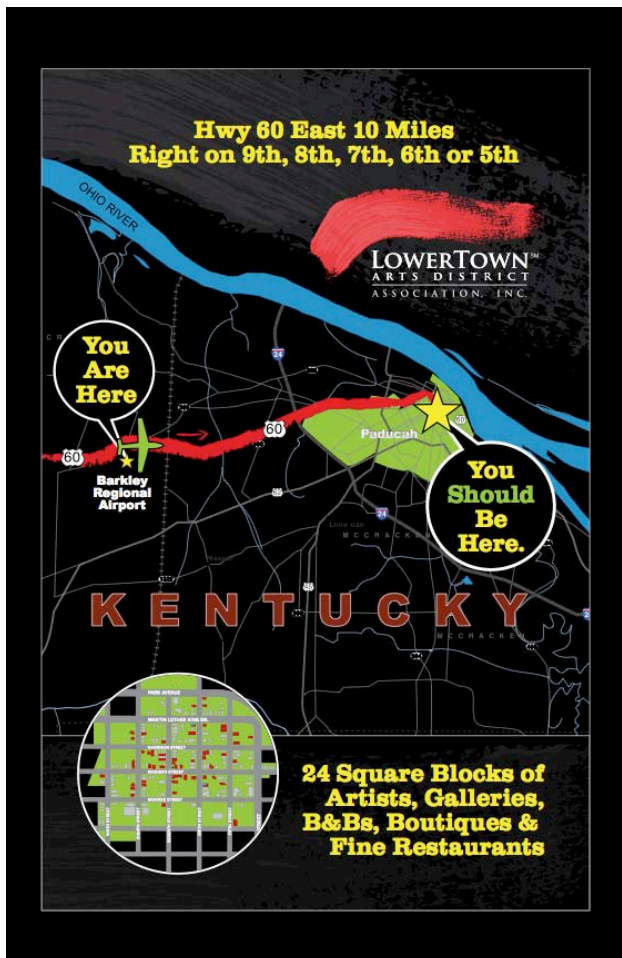
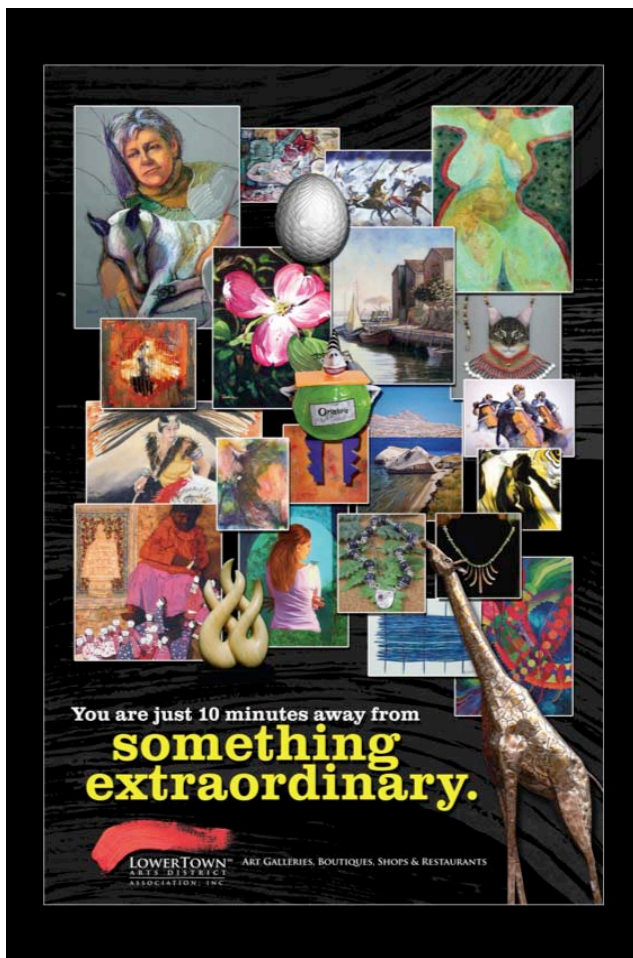


Tim was an air traffic controller for a year. For the past twenty years he has been a professional corporate pilot.

“It’s important for people coming into Paducah to understand what we have. Some have heard a little about Lower Town. What we really want is to WOW them,” Paulette Mentor, artist and a Lower Town spokesperson said.

Two posters that showcase the artists and their work will be unveiled next week in an airport terminal display case. Many of the 38 members of the Lower Town Arts District Association and local dignitaries will be on hand for the ceremonial unveiling. The exact date and time will be announced soon.

The posters show a variety of the artists’ work. Carved eggs made by a sculptor, pottery, paintings of all kinds, and bead work are featured.
